Other companies normally take about nine months. The clothes also change from week to week, so customers keep coming to see what's new. It produces 20,000 new designs a year – and none of them stay in the shops for more than a month.

So if you've seen a new jacket or skirt you like in a Zara store, hurry up and buy it, because it won't be there for long.
