LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

Courses for exchange students are carried out in English and we expect that nominated students have sufficient fluency in English in order to study. Students are required to have a minimum of level B2 for all courses offered to exchange students.

Level B2 (CEFR) is equivalent to IELTS minimum score: 5.0 or TOEFL minimum score: 60.

The language requirements do not apply to students with English as their first language.

How to document English proficiency

We consider the nomination as confirmation of the students' English proficiency at level B2.

STUDY PERMIT AND LEGAL RESIDENCE

EU/EEA citizens do not require a study permit to enter or study in Norway. However, they must register at www.udi.no (The Norwegian Directorate of Immigration) prior to arrival in order to finalize their permit registration after arrival.

Non-EU/EEA citizens must apply for a temporary residence permit for educational purposes prior to arrival to Norway. As per 01.01.2023 the cost to apply for a study permit is 5900 NOK.

INSURANCE

We strongly recommend all international students, regardless of the length of their stay to have a valid health and travel insurance. It is the student's responsibility to make insurance arrangements for any accident, illness, injury, loss or damage to persons or property during the study period in Norway.
